Together they assembled packets for 6 different teaching modules that will benefit approximately 900 second graders. A total of 10 AmeriCorps members and 4 staff participated at this service site. A total of 64 cumulative hours served.

Clarion, Jefferson, Erie, and Crawford Counties



Youth and adult AmeriCorps members from Girard School District met at the Elk Valley Elementary school to complete various projects. They organized the food pantry and cleared furniture that was left over from last year's renovations. They also deep cleaned the sensory room, hung student drawings and organized books for the One Book, One School program. A total of 9 AmeriCorps members spent a cumulative 36 hours making Elk Valley Elementary a better place for the 522 children it serves.





AmeriCorps members from Fairview School District served at the Food pantry at the Fairview Presbyterian Church. They took all the items off the shelves, wiped them down and reorganized the food. They also cleaned the floors and wiped down the 4 industrial grade refrigerators. AmeriCorps members Clara and Jasmine spent a cumulative 12 hours on this service project.

The House of Trades team removed a pool table to create more space in reparation for STEM tables being constructed for the program, the carpets and floors were scrubbed and boxes of Halloween costume donations were taken to Hope 21 for storage. While at Hope 21 (a free clothing boutique for the community), they were able to clean since they solely rely on volunteers. This consisted of wiping down all the racks, toys, windows and mirrors. They also swept, vacuumed and moped the entire space. 3 Keystone SMILES staff and 3 AmeriCorps members helped to get the job done, culminative of 24 hours of service.






#### STEM Tables, Venango County
